- **School Partnerships** with educators, parents, students and other stakeholders in the Trenton, Ewing and Lawrence Township public school districts. These partnerships provide resources focusing on student and teacher performance, curriculum and program development, and more.
- Children's Defense Fund (CDF) Freedom Schools that we support financially in Trenton and Camden. We helped establish the Camden CDF Freedom School in 2015.

Promoting opportunity through education

ETS has worked closely with the New Jersey Department of Education and other organizations to promote and expand educational opportunities throughout the state.

We collaborate with the:

- **New Jersey Teacher of the Year program** by funding a six-month sabbatical for the New Jersey State Teacher of the Year. This support allows the teacher's district to pay a full-time substitute while the Teacher of the Year undertakes his or her responsibilities.
- **Education Law Center** (ELC) by partnering on several activities throughout the year. Through these projects, we help advocate for equal educational opportunity for New Jersey's public school students.
- Mercer County Instructional Leadership Council (MCILC) by holding one of two non-district seats
 on the MCILC, which includes the Assistant Superintendents of Curriculum and Instruction from all
 Mercer County school districts. The group meets monthly to discuss policy implementation, common
 challenges and successful solutions.
- **Princeton University Preparatory Program** (PUPP) recently conducted an evaluation of the program through our Policy Evaluation & Research Center (PERC). PERC's work on PUPP, an academic and cultural enrichment program, focuses on the academic outcomes of its current scholars and alumni.
- Office of the Secretary of New Jersey Higher Education by serving on the Student Success
 Advisory Council. This group aims to address opportunity and achievement gaps among
 underserved college students.
- **New Jersey Governor's Educator of the Year Awards program** by recognizing Mercer County educators for their outstanding teaching and professional service. These annual awards highlight the educational innovations, achievements and rewards of teaching, as well as the important services outside the classroom that lead to student success.
- New Jersey School Boards Association by sponsoring its annual New Member Orientation Program.

An assessment and testing leader

ETS serves government agencies, education institutions and individuals by providing solutions for teacher certification; English language learning; and elementary, secondary and postsecondary education. We also conduct education research, analysis and policy studies.

Licensure

The Praxis Series® Assessments — More than 50,000 teacher licensure tests are administered annually to teacher candidates. *The Praxis Series* tests include more than 80 titles to ensure full coverage of New Jersey endorsement areas.

Higher Education

The GRE® Tests — More than 10,000 higher education students demonstrate their readiness for graduate-level work by taking the GRE tests. Many New Jersey graduate and business schools rely on these tests to inform admissions decisions.


SIR II[™] Reports — More than 272,000 student instruction report surveys were administered in 2015 across New Jersey higher education institutions. Many of the state's institutions rely on the SIR report to provide objective student perceptions of their higher education learning experience.

ETS® Proficiency Profile (EPP) — EPP supports many institutions as they satisfy accreditation requirements and measure student performance by assessing and providing data around four core skill areas — critical thinking, writing, reading and mathematics. In 2015, nearly 4,000 higher education students participated in EPP.

High School Equivalency

The HiSET® Exam — In 2015, nearly 1,000 individuals earned the New Jersey State-Issued High School Diploma by completing the HiSET battery. The HiSET exam provides an affordable and accessible way to achieve high school equivalency.
